We have pleasure to invite you to submit an abstract for a brief presentation (20 minutes) at the 2nd International Conference on Bowen Family Systems Theory. The Conference will be held at The Hong Kong Polytechnic University, Hong Kong. Presenters will have the opportunity to share their best thinking on the theory and practice of Bowen theory in the following learning tracks:

- Bowen theory in faith communities
- Bowen theory in business and organizational settings
- Bowen theory training around the world
- Bowen theory, Science, and Research

Details of submission:

- Abstracts should be submitted in English, and the maximum length is 400 words.
- You may submit more than one abstract.
- Please include a separate cover sheet: Title of the presentation(s), presenter name (s) with their titles, affiliations, email addresses and phone numbers.
- Selection of the abstracts will be considered on basis of the soundness of the presenter's thinking about Bowen theory, their relevance to the Conference theme and the learning tracks.
- The Scientific Committee will review the proposals. Selected abstracts will be presented in concurrent sessions at the Conference.
- Registration of the Conference is necessary for the acceptance of abstracts.

This Conference features:

- 3 Keynote Speeches by Dr. Anne S. McKnight, Ms. Kathleen K. Wiseman, and Dr. Michael E. Kerr.
- More than 20 theory and topical presentations/workshops by invited speakers, addressing the use of Bowen theory in families, clinical settings, organizations, business and communities. The theory and practice of Bowen theory, and the challenges of managing a responsible self in a variety of contexts will be examined.
- Brief Presentations of selected papers (each presentation: 20 minutes)

The Conference begins on May 17, 2018 (Thurs) at 9 a.m. and ends on May 19, 2018 (Sat) 5:15 pm, followed by the Closing Dinner. Each day starts with a Keynote Speech, followed by a Theory Session (Basic Theory Group and Advanced Theory Group), and concurrent Topical Presentations / Brief Presentations. The Keynote Speeches, Theory Sessions, and Topical Presentations are 1 hour each, while Brief Presentations are 20 minutes each.

Conference attendees will have the opportunities to:

- enrich their understanding of systems thinking, to develop greater capacity to see the "big picture", the reciprocity and interrelationships in human systems.
- learn ways to enhance resilience and effective self-management in the home, clinical, organization and community contexts with systems thinking.
- examine and address social phenomena in varied social contexts and cultures through the systems perspective.
- explore training and research ideas that bridge cultural and geographical boundaries, using Bowen theory as a guiding theoretical framework.
